

Parcel scam warning

RESIDENTS are being advised to beware of a parcel delivery scam set up by a company operating in Belize.

A card could be posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel to you and asking people to contact them on a premium rate number.

Trading Standards officers are warn-

ing the public not to call this number. If you do call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed £15 for the phone call.

If you receive a card bearing the company name PDS, Trading Standards advise that you contact Royal Mail Fraud on 0207 2396 655, or the premium rate service regulator, ICSTIS at www.icstis.org.uk
